Did you know?

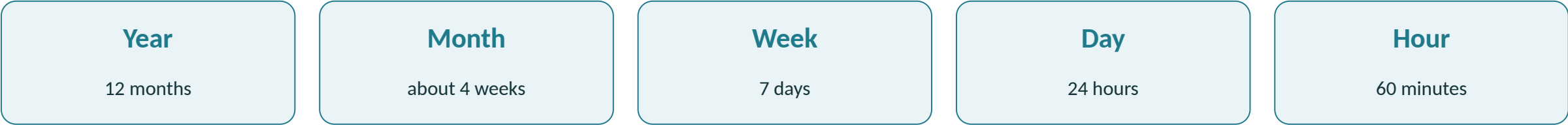
We use years, months, weeks, days and hours to describe how long things take (duration) and the order they happen in (sequence). A year is the longest of these and an hour is the shortest.

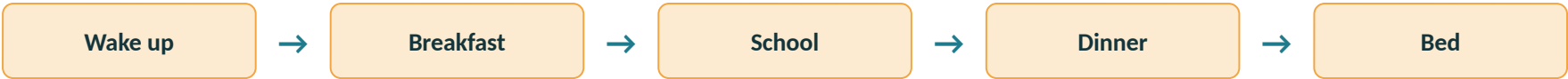
