understand that the structure of a complex sentence includes a main clause and at least one dependent clause, and understand how writers can use this structure for effect

Learning intention

- understand that the structure of a complex sentence includes a main clause and at least one dependent clause, and understand how writers can use this structure for effect

Teach and model

- knowing that complex sentences make connections between ideas to provide a reason; for example, "He jumped up because the bell rang."; state a purpose; for example...

Check understanding

- Explain the main idea in that the structure of a complex sentence includes a main... using an example.
- Show the idea in a second way: with words, a model, a diagram or symbols.
- Apply the idea to a short unfamiliar situation and justify the result.

Teaching cautions

- Ask the student to explain their choice, not only state an answer.
- Check that key vocabulary is understood in a new example.
- Mix representations so the skill is transferred rather than copied.

Quick lesson sequence

- Connect to prior knowledge and introduce the key vocabulary.
- Model one clear example, then solve a second example together.
- Finish with an independent check and a short student explanation.
