

Explain how texts are structured depending on their purpose and...

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Learning intention

- explain how texts are structured depending on their purpose and how language features vary, recognising that some texts are hybrids that combine different genres or...

Teach and model

- recognising how texts such as critical responses to texts, expositions, text interpretations and discussions are typically structured to achieve their purpose
- discussing how the placement of images and written text in a linear or non-linear way, such as online texts, is used differently in a variety of texts for a purpose
- explaining the structure and language features of texts such as narratives, literary recounts, memoirs, drama scripts, types of poems, formal speeches, comparisons and...

Check understanding

- Explain the main idea in explain how texts are structured depending on their purpose and... using an example.
- Show the idea in a second way: with words, a model, a diagram or symbols.
- Apply the idea to a short unfamiliar situation and justify the result.

Teaching cautions

- Ask the student to explain their choice, not only state an answer.
- Check that key vocabulary is understood in a new example.
- Mix representations so the skill is transferred rather than copied.

Quick lesson sequence

- Connect to prior knowledge and introduce the key vocabulary.
- Model one clear example, then solve a second example together.
- Finish with an independent check and a short student explanation.
