Learning intention

- explain the ways that ideas and points of view may represent the values of individuals and groups in literary texts, drawn from historical, social and cultural contexts, by...

Teach and model

- discussing representations of characters from historical contexts in literary texts; for example, discussing the romantic representation of the Australian swagman...
- explaining attitudes and ideas about the natural world in literary texts drawn from contexts different to their own

Check understanding

- Explain the main idea in explain the ways that ideas and points of view may... using an example.
- Show the idea in a second way: with words, a model, a diagram or symbols.
- Apply the idea to a short unfamiliar situation and justify the result.

Teaching cautions

- Ask the student to explain their choice, not only state an answer.
- Check that key vocabulary is understood in a new example.
- Mix representations so the skill is transferred rather than copied.

Quick lesson sequence

- Connect to prior knowledge and introduce the key vocabulary.
- Model one clear example, then solve a second example together.
- Finish with an independent check and a short student explanation.
