Learning intention

- use comprehension strategies such as visualising, predicting, connecting, summarising, monitoring, questioning and inferring to compare and contrast ideas and...

Teach and model

- comparing and contrasting visual representations of ideas, issues or events in online news reporting
- comparing the representation of an event in print and digital sources, summarising their qualities, identifying opinions and analysing evidence
- summarising articles representing a current event comparing and contrasting ideas and opinions in and between texts

Check understanding

- Explain the main idea in comprehension strategies such as visualising, predicting, connecting, summarising, monitoring, questioning... using an example.
- Show the idea in a second way: with words, a model, a diagram or symbols.
- Apply the idea to a short unfamiliar situation and justify the result.

Teaching cautions

- Ask the student to explain their choice, not only state an answer.
- Check that key vocabulary is understood in a new example.
- Mix representations so the skill is transferred rather than copied.

Quick lesson sequence

- Connect to prior knowledge and introduce the key vocabulary.
- Model one clear example, then solve a second example together.
- Finish with an independent check and a short student explanation.
